The Dickinson State University art gallery began operation in 1972 by Dennis Navrat, professor of Art at DSU, under the name of Mind's Eye Art Gal-

lery. Previously located in Stoxen Library, the only art

gallery in Dickinson at the time was a cooperative venture of the Department of Art, The Badlands Art Association, and Stoxen Library.

In August of 1997, the gallery was moved to its present location. Located on the lower level of Klinefelter Hall, the gallery features a variety of fine arts mediums created by visiting artists, local artists, and the university's faculty and students.

The gallery is open from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday thru Friday.
