2. Dickinson House

227 Sims Street

Built by 1902, and possibly as early as 1898, this Homestead style house was the home of the H. L. Dickinson family. Dickinson was one of the area's first homesteaders, and in 1882 had a farm near the current intersection of Villard Street and Seventh Avenue West. He formed the Dickinson Mercantile Company in 1891 with his brother L.G. Dickinson. The city of Dickinson is named for H. L. Dickinson's cousin, Wells S. Dickinson, a senator from the state of New York and land agent for the Northern Pacific Railroad.

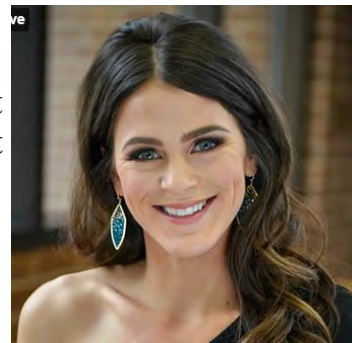
