Although she's lived several other places, Elizabeth A. Smith is a native Montanan who returned home to raise her two children. She received a BA in Fine Art with honors from Northern State University, Aberdeen, SD in 2001. Elizabeth appeared in Volumes 12 and 13 of NSU's Shelterbelt, a bound publication intended to recognize exceptional work in the arts. She's run her own business since 2007, which underwent a marvelous transformation in 2016 as part of the Montana Artrepreneur Program. A "Jane" of all trades, Elizabeth is a studio painter, multi-media artist, graphic designer, book binder, photographer, and crafter. She's hosted three gallery exhibitions of her own work and participated in several juried shows, as well as numerous art events. She was honored to serve as the juror for Subjective Perspective in 2020, hosted by the WaterWorks Art Museum in Miles City, MT. She's trained as a gallery assistant, framing and hanging art for the public, and has worked as a grant writer, gathering funds to advance community projects. However, after completing a double masters and state certification, she currently serves as a school counselor in Terry, MT. Elizabeth recognizes the immense value of art in creating pride of place and salving the human soul. Therefore, she is overjoyed to have the opportunity to jury a show for the Badlands Art Association.

Old Business:

### **I. Annual Art Show**

Tod will be starting the White Drug floor refinishing project on July 8 th . Volunteers are needed. We will be working out details of online payment for show registration and hope to mail out the call soon. Elizabeth Smith from Sidney, Montana will be our judge. We do not plan on hiring any musicians at this time, but will check into the possibility of the mall having a piano or using pre-recorded music.

### **II. Badlands Art Gallery**

We need to set up a volunteer schedule that can be emailed out or posted at an easily available web site. We really need help from volunteers who would be willing to man the gallery. For the summer, it was decided to keep our open hours from 2-5 on Wednesday- Saturday. We need to advertise our new hours through Heart River Voice, Dickinson Press, radio community announcements and other community announcement boards. We need outdoor signage like a feather banner or a real-estate style of sign. We will consider doing scheduled openings for special groups like retirement communities. We should consider having a sponsorship placard placed in an obvious location in the gallery to list our sponsors/contributors.

### **III. Summer Activity**

We have tabled the idea of a summer sale for this year in view of the challenges in setting up the gallery this year.

### **IV. Outdoor Art Space/Park**

We need to formally complete our proposal and present it.

New Business/Items from the floor
