Secretary's Minutes

Old Business:

1. Updates for the 2022 Annual Art Show

- A. The floor needs some TLC and we can start as early as April with stripping and buffing.
- B. We want to start looking for a grant/funding for new standards.
 - 1. We are considering 8x4 grid standards.
 - 2. We could start with 16 and use them for elementary art displays.
 - 3. Tod has made attempts at some funding. He is waiting on a response.
- C. If Vicky Gullickson is leaving, we may need a new student organizer for the annual show.
- D. We would like to use the cage storage at White Drug going forward if that is possible.
- 2. Updates for the Summer Workshop
 - A. 13 are registered with 11 paid.
 - B. Karen is willing to take 20 participants, but 15 might fit better. Therefore, no more blanket emails because we are so close to the participation limit.
 - C. Jan has a data base of art educators' information and has sent out the workshop information to them.
 - D. The continuing education credit is approved; we are waiting to see if it can be managed through the website.

3. Gallery Updates

- A. Dickinson State University gallery student show will go up soon; this Friday, it should be set up and we could work out to go visit.
 - 1. Talk to Greg if you are interested in visiting.
 - 2. The first show we will produce will be from the collection of DSU. After that, it will be open for other artists in July.
 - 3. We will take sales and need to be manning the site. It will have a key card for entry.

We need a sales tax id.

- 4. We need to work out the details of the cash box and payments.
- 5. We need to develop a commission and keep it reasonable--20-25 percent.
- 6. This Dickinson State Gallery is for BAA, not SW Art Gallery and Science Center (SWAGSC). Donations sought need to be for BAA and this gallery only.

- 4. Completing the Election of Officers and other available roles for membership
 - A. Treasurer, Jan Stromsborg—formally elected.
 - B. Publicity, Print Media—still an open position; need to elect.
 - C. Keisha Sparks was invited to work with the art instructor liaisons, but may not be available at this time to do it.
 - D. In order to complete the paperwork to assign additional signees for the bank account, we needed to formalize our minutes to show full names for the officers: Treasurer (Jan Stromsborg), President (Tod Winters), Grant Writer (Rebecca Ferderer and Ruth Heley)
 - E. We need to Complete paperwork to assign additional individuals to have access to the P.O. Box as of yet, but Tod Winters has started the process. As Show Chair (Tod Winters/Cherie Roshau), President (Tod Winters) and Treasurer (Jan Stromsborg), they will be set up for access.
- Announcement: The Taube traveling student art show is on display at the Dickinson Museum from March 3
 -April 18th.
 - A. The new curator was a little unfamiliar with the process, but Jan gave her some information.
 - B. We agreed to pay for the shipment of art back to Minot at the end of the show.

New Business:

- 1. Entertain ideas for a summer outreach activity
 - A. Is it too late to do some kind of art in the park or garage sale art?
 - B. If we do a "garage sale art" event, we want to keep it informal and unframed.
 - C. Could we find a big garage-like building? What about the downtown art alley, downtown buildings that are vacant, First on First?
 - D. Bernie might have some buildings that we could look into. Parker will check out the downtown bank building and the building across from the Rock and will report back to us on the downtown situation.
- 2. Items from the floor or further announcements
 - .A Elizabeth wants to meet with someone to work out details of her internship and get help looking for grants to support her efforts.
 - She will be using an elective to work this out with her credits. She needs to develop a time management plan.
 - B. Thanks to Tressa and good wishes—we provided her contact information so she could send art to us.
