Student Artful Natural Earth Contest



Within the BAA's 2022 Student show, there is a new category, Artful Natural Earth Contest ND 2022. The contest is open to all students entering the BAA Student Art Show. Their art works can be of any media and size, but they must be framed or matted and ready to hang. Artworks will be hung within the BAA Student Show grade divisions and be identified with a 4x6 index card attached to the entry. All artworks

must represent native species to the United States and be found in North Dakota. Each student may only enter one artwork in this contest. The art works can be in one of five categories; 1. Old Business:

Annual Art Show

I. Floors at White Drug

A. Final coat of wax will be accomplished after the Halloween store moves out.

II. Artist Statements

III. We did not include a spot to write out a statement in the entry forms this year. We will put a notice in the following newsletter, inviting artists to submit a statement if they wish. The statement should include a simple account of the artist's philosophy with some biographical information.

IV. Ribbon and Awards

A. In addition to the named awards--Bev Haus, Austin Cole, Women Empowering Women and Jackie Church awards--we also have new awards from Connect Clinic.

V. Visitor and Convention Bureau grant

A. Boosting an ad on Facebook was suggested as a way to use some of the money as well as a billboard advertisement.

A. Elizabeth's intern experience may include: typing in entries, show cards, show booklet as these jobs can be efficiently done together. She may also work with intake of art at the annual show. She submits reports to the secretary weekly on any BAA activities

she works on.

VI. Silent Auction

A. We will close out the silent basket auction on Sunday.

B. We will do the silent auction of art on opening night of the show as in the past.

VII. Reception

A. We plan to do an opening night reception which will include wine and cheese/meat trays or some similar option. We are working on the budget and logistics.

Badlands Art Gallery

I. Pick-up day for Artists from the Prairies: September 27 th from 3-7.

A. We discussed how to contact photographers for the next show. We considered contacting the Chamber of Commerce and Consolidated for past winners of their photography contests.

II. There will be no set day to accept art for the Photography show. They may drop off art when the gallery is regularly open.

III. Digital photo frame

A. We would like to contact the museum to see if we might use digital files of historic photos and play them on a digital frame.

IV. Changes to Artist Submission Form

A. Changes were made to make space for multiple submissions on one form so less forms need to be filled out.

V. Shows for winter and spring of 2023

A. Solo shows and themed shows were suggested. They could include landscapes, portraits, "Heroes", found/recycled objects. Share any ideas that interest you!

VI. Receptions

A. We discussed how to reduce the cost of receptions. Many agreed that we probably don't have the manpower and time to do the food prep ourselves, but also agreed that we might be able to partially do it and/or utilize the grocery stores for meat and cheese trays or such.

A. They are seeking a way to feature their resident's art. We suggested having the residents enter our annual show.
